

FOR THE PROPOSED COYOTE ELECTRODE CABLE REPLACEMENT

PROJECT


The City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) is proposing to implement the Coyote Electrode Cable Replacement Project located in San Bernardino County, California. As the Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the LADWP has prepared an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) which evaluates the potential environmental effects of the proposed project.

Project Location

The proposed project is located within San Bernardino County, on land administered by the Bureau of Land Management. The project is in a remote open desert area traversed by dirt roads east of the Coyote Dry Lake bed in Yermo California, and approximately 20 miles northeast of the City Barstow. (Refer to project location map).

Project Description

The Coyote Electrode Cable Replacement Project would replace approximately 10,000 feet of Direct Current (DC) electrode cables in the Mojave Desert in an existing right-of-way on federal land under the jurisdiction of the United States Department of the Interior Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The Project would improve the operation of the underground electrode facility, thereby reducing the need for system maintenance, testing, and repair, and reducing exposure of the system to hazardous conditions and materials.
